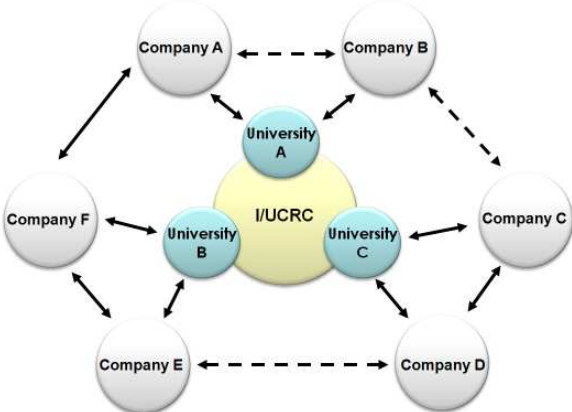


What is the Center for Health Organization Transformation?

Master of Public Health in Health Policy & Management

- Designed to meet the needs of current healthcare professionals in South Texas interested in how health care is organized, delivered and financed
- Graduate students complete a program of study that provides a mixture of management instruction with the study of health policy
- Emphasis on rural policy issues and management practices provide the student with a truly unique opportunity to enhance careers in healthcare management
- MPH degree typically takes 3 years (taking two courses per semester and one course in the summers)
- GRE requirement is waived for physicians, dentists and others with doctoral degrees
- Evening classes geared towards working professionals
